Notes to Prize Pool

- (A) \$10,000 payable to the WSOP®. WSOP® seat fee will be held in escrow per Participation Agreement. \$350 paid in cash to winner.
- (B) Alternative cash prize is awarded at the end of the Tournament.
- (C) If less than 100 players, one seat will be awarded for every fifty players.
- (D) Ten winners of five Team Cleveland events held November 15th, 2008 through April, 2009 will participate in a final table in May, 2009 with a \$10,000 prize pool (\$5,000 1st place, \$3,000 2nd place and \$2,000 3rd place.)

Each round is 30 minutes. All further blinds will increase by 10,000 per round.

HOUSE RULES

1. This is a charitable event. Treat the dealers with respect. Players will be removed from Festival for abusing a dealer or any other volunteer; or for profanity, loud or unruly conduct, cheating, collusion or any other inappropriate conduct.
2. Players cannot remove tournament chips from the tournament area or take them out of view of play at the table.
3. If the dealer should accidentally show the bottom (or any) card, the dealer shall show the card to all players, and the card becomes the next burn card.
4. If the dealer turns over a card while dealing, the dealer keeps dealing and comes back to the player whose card was turned over and deals another. The card turned over becomes the next burn card.
5. If the dealer turns over 2 cards while dealing, a misdeal is called and the hand starts over.
6. It is the player's responsibility to ensure that they have 2 cards. If a player has, or has been dealt, too few or too many cards, his/her hand is dead at the point where the mistake is discovered and his/her money/ chips bet remain in the pot and the hand continues.
7. Players must keep their cards on or above the playing surface at all times.
8. No player may show their hand to another player who is still playing. If so, both hands become dead.
9. No smoking or alcoholic beverages allowed in the Festival Center
10. No cell phones allowed in the tournament area
11. English only may be spoken in the tournament area
12. No food in tournament area.
13. All floor decisions by the Participating Charity are final.

Note: Day One ends at midnight or when the field is reduced to 20 players, whichever is earlier. Unsold seats at the beginning of the tournament will be sold until the 1st break to any new player or a player who has lost all their chips.
